

Year 6 – Summer Term Curriculum Plan 2025

Topics - A Greek Odyssey : Travelling On

This plan is to give you an insight into the topics your child will be covering this term- it is not intended as extra homework, just a prompt for some discussions you might want to have at home.



English 	In the run-up to our end of key stage tests, we will be revising all of the spelling and grammar rules taught in Year 5 and Year 6. We will be practising answering questions in timed conditions and finding evidence within a text to support our answers. Our class texts will be a range of Greek myths. After the half term, we will be reading Wonder, by R J Palacio, which will allow us to concentrate on theme of transition to a new setting. We collate our final writing pieces for our portfolios.
Maths 	To help the children prepare for their tests in May, we will be continuing to work on the speed at which they answer mental arithmetic questions. We will also be revising units covered in Years 5 and 6. After the tests, the children will have the opportunity to investigate and reason a series of open ended problems, puzzles and mini projects.
Science 	This half term, our Science topic is Animals Including Humans. We will be learning about the human body, identifying the main parts of the human circulatory system. Our last half term, will be focussed on Reproduction and Relationships; linking closely with our PSHE curriculum.
Computing 	In Computing, children will be completing a series of lessons relating to 3D Modelling. These will include modifying 3D objects, making their own name badge, culminating in planning and making their own 3D model.
Art & DT 	We will be looking at Ancient Greek art and architecture, including famous buildings such as the Acropolis and Parthenon. We will examine repeating patterns and geometric designs. Children will improve their mastery of art and design techniques and sketch, shade and draw objects to scale. They will design, create and analyse their own products.
Geography 	This term, we will be looking at where the Ancient Greeks lived and how Greece is - and was - connected to other countries. Children will revise the water cycle; examining ancient and modern irrigation techniques.
History 	The children will be encouraged to ask questions, compile independent research and consider how to present work based on life in Ancient Greece. They will consider the achievements of the Greeks, building an understanding of the influence this time period has had on the Western World.
PE 	Athletics and preparation for the Borough Sports will be the first focus of lessons this term. Children will also play Rounders. In these lessons, they will develop skills in playing competitive games, improving their own performances as they strive to achieve personal bests. Our residential trip to Danbury will provide opportunities for children to take part in some

	<p>outdoor, adventurous activities; working both individual and in a team to overcome challenges.</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>Our Music lessons this term, will focus on preparing for our summer production. The children will be taught to play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts.</p>
<p>PSHE Personal, Health, Social, Community, Emotional Education</p> 	<p>Lessons this term, will focus on relationships and children will learn about the physical and emotional changes that happen to their bodies as they go through puberty. Alongside this, children will explore issues surrounding body image and self-worth. Transition will be a major theme in the second half of the summer term as we prepare the children for secondary school in September.</p>
<p>RE</p>	<p>In RE this term, Year 6 will be looking at answering the question: Is it better to express religion in arts and architecture, or in charity and generosity?</p>
<p>MFL Modern Foreign Languages</p> 	<p>In French, we will be finishing the unit linked to Les Vêtements (Clothes) and moving onto À Le Week-end (At the Weekend).</p>
