	English	Maths
Monday	<p><b>LI: To answer questions about a story.</b>  This week we are going to be using the English lessons from Oak National Academy which can be found by clicking this link  <a href="https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom/year-1#schedule_week-4_week-4-day-Monday">https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom/year-1#schedule_week-4_week-4-day-Monday</a>  We will be working on week 4. Begin with</p>	<p><b>LI: To understand weight and mass.</b>  We measure the weight of an object to see how heavy it is. We say that how heavy an object is depends on how much mass it has. A heavier object has more mass. The elephant has more mass than the mouse so it is heavier. Do you remember when we used balance scales in school to weigh objects? Watch two videos on White</p>

	<p>Mondays English lesson- The Tiger who came to Tea.</p> <p>The video is a complete lesson and looks at phonics, spellings and an English activity. Watch the whole video and complete the activities.</p>	<p>Rose Maths <a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</a></p> <p>You need to click on Week 1 (not summer term) and look at lessons 1 and 2. Watch both the videos and then try the activity sheet for lesson 2.</p>
Tuesday	<p><b>LI: To commit a story to memory.</b></p> <p>On the Oak National academy website, click on Tuesday and watch the English lesson on committing a story to memory. You will recap the story from yesterday and have a go at drawing a story map.</p>	<p><b>LI: To compare mass.</b></p> <p>Watch the video on White Rose maths for week 1 lesson 3 and try the activity.</p> <p>Have a go at comparing the weight of objects around your home. Hold an object in each hand and see which feels heaviest. Try to use the correct language. If you have any scales in your home, you can try weighing the objects.</p> <p>Now try the activity set on My Maths- comparing Mass.</p> <p>Extension- You could always try a bit of baking and measure out the ingredients.</p>
Wednesday	<p><b>LI: To identify and write questions.</b></p> <p>On the Oak National academy website, click on Wednesday and watch the English lesson on questions. This is a recap of what we did for our home learning a couple of weeks ago but a very important skill. You will be asked to write some questions based on the story you have looked at this week.</p>	<p><b>LI: To understand measure capacity.</b></p> <p>Remember capacity is a measure of how much liquid a container can hold. Watch two videos on White Rose Maths <a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</a></p> <p>You need to click on Week 1 (not summer term) and look at lessons 3 and 4. Watch both the videos and then try the activity sheet for lesson 4.</p> <p>Now have a look at My Maths and try the activity- comparing capacity.</p> <p>Extension- If the weather is nice, try playing with some water. Try to fill a larger container with smaller cups</p>

		using a bucket of water. Make a guess as to how many cups will fill the container before you start. Count carefully and make sure the cups are full each time.
Thursday	<p><b>LI: To write a story.</b></p> <p>On the Oak National academy website, click on Thursday and watch the English lesson on starting to write a story. In this lesson you will write the first half of the story with the teacher using your story map from Tuesday.</p>	<p><b>LI: To compare length.</b></p> <p>Do you remember when we learnt about length in school? We can measure things using rulers and tape measures and measure in cm and m but we can also measure in other ways, using different objects. Watch this video about measuring <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YzACucjF38">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YzACucjF38</a></p> <p>Have a go at measuring some things around your house. You could measure with a ruler or with any items that are all the same size e.g. pieces of lego, paperclips etc. Or why not measure in body parts. How many hands high is your table? Record your results on paper. Then try the My Maths activity- comparing lengths.</p>
Friday	<p><b>LI: To write a story.</b></p> <p>On the Oak National academy website, click on Friday and watch the English lesson on writing the end of a story. In this lesson you will finish your story with the teacher.</p>	<p><b>LI: To practise my mental maths skills.</b></p> <p>Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Then play Hit the Button <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</a> to improve your recall of number bonds, doubles and halves.</p>
