Enrichment Tasks

- VE Day – At school, we would have re-visited our World War Two theme as we commemorate the 75th anniversary of Victory in Europe Day (VE day) on the 8th May. The importance of this date is recognised this year as the traditional May Day Bank Holiday has been moved to the 8th of May. Due to the current restrictions we are living under, many celebrations and events which were planned, including at school, will not now take place. However, this is no reason not to remember this date and commemorate it in different ways to those which we had planned.
- We would like you to create a fact sheet about VE day explaining what it is and why it is so significant in the history of our country. Your writing should include headings and sub-headings, paragraphs and at least one picture with a caption. It should make reference to key people including Winston Churchill and King George V1. You should describe how the people celebrated and how they were feeling. Imagine how children felt - many had only known what it was like to live during war time. You can create your fact sheet on paper, on a computer as a word document or even create a power point presentation if you prefer.
- Begin by watching these newsreel clips – watch out for the speeches by Winston Churchill and the King. See how the people celebrated and watch out for our Queen, Elizabeth II as she appears on the balcony of Buckingham Palace.
