If you don't have any, you could make some using some circles of paper that you label either 1p or 2p (make sure they are different sizes) or print up the coins from the resources. Make up some larger amounts using the coins e.g. five 1p coins to make 5p. Maybe you would like to set yourself up a shop. Label some items with prices up to 20p and pay for one of the items using your coins.</p>

<p><b>Enrichment Tasks</b></p> <p>This week as part of our Science and Art lessons we would have been exploring 'Under the sea'. Have a go at some of these tasks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>What creatures would you find under the sea? Investigate this question using books or the internet. You could focus on just larger creatures or explore some of the small or microscopic creatures you might find, or both. It is up to you how you record what you have found. - Create an under the sea picture. If you have paints at home you could use those to create a sea background using blue, white and black paint. Have a look at these videos for ideas (they use special paints but you can use whatever you have). Just think about not just painting the whole background one shade of blue, try to make some bits lighter by using white and some bit darker by using black.

Then either draw, paint and cut out some sea creatures to stick onto your background or wait for your background to be completely dry then draw some animals on to it using felt pens (you could do them in black pen so they look like silhouettes if you prefer. Maybe you could also add some plants too. Have a look at the example pictures in the resources to give you some ideas.

If you do not have paints at home, don't worry. You can create your own picture using anything you have. What about felt pens, chalks, collage, colouring pencils? Be creative and most importantly, have fun!
