Butser Ancient Farm




Butser Ancient Farm is a farm and archaeological site in Hampshire. Historians and archaeologists use the farm to try and work out how people in the past might have lived. They do experiments to work out how ancient people cooked, made things and built houses.

What can you see there?

Butser Ancient Farm is open to the public and to school groups. You can visit reconstructed Iron Age roundhouses and a Roman Villa. You might want to have a go at making a mosaic, doing some pottery or weaving or learning how to write in Ancient runes!

There is a lot to explore and plenty of places to eat lunch. We also have Visitor Centre and shop, where you can find out more about the site and buy a souvenir of your trip.
