	English	Maths
Monday	<p><b>LI: To listen to a story and to talk about it.</b></p> <p>In this lesson, we will be learning about the story of Saint George and the Dragon. We will be practising our sound of the week and finding out our new spellings. Tuesday	<b>LI: To commit a story to memory</b>	<b>LI: To add two digit numbers to ones.</b>

	<p>In this lesson, we will be drawing our story maps to help us to remember the story of Saint George and the Dragon. We will also practise reading words with our sound of the week in. Remember we always put the biggest number in our head first and then count on the smallest number. In this lesson the teacher talks about using dienes equipment, that is the same as what we call Base 10.</p> <p>When you finish the lesson, have a go at the end of lesson quiz.</p> <p>If you would like to continue with this, there are additional sheets in the resources called 'adding two digit numbers to ones'. You do not have to complete these sheets, they are there if you would like extra work.</p>
Wednesday	<p><b>LI: To describe a character's appearance</b></p> <p>In this lesson, we are going to be drawing our own versions of the dragon story. We are then going to be focusing on using adjectives to describe our dragon's appearance. We can use our strategy of putting the biggest number in our head but remember we need to count backwards if we are taking away and sometimes this is trickier than counting forwards. The teacher looks at some other ways to work out the answers. If you need a number line to help you, there is one saved with the resources.</p> <p>When you finish the lesson, have a go at the end of lesson quiz.</p> <p>If you would like to continue with this, there are additional sheets in the resources called 'subtracting two digit numbers and ones'. You do not have to complete these</p>

		sheets, they are there if you would like extra work.
Thursday	<p><b>LI: To describe a character's personality</b></p> <p>In this lesson, we are going to think about the dragon's personality and how the story tells us about this. We will then be choosing adjectives to describe the dragon's personality. Friday	<p><b>LI: To write a character description.</b></p> <p>In this lesson, we are going to be writing our character description for our dragons. We will be using the adjectives we have learnt to describe them and also working on some independent sentences. Remember to use your numberline to count backwards. The teacher goes on to use dienes to work out the answer, if you find this tricky just carry on using your numberline by counting backwards.</p> <p>When you finish the lesson, have a go at the end of lesson quiz.</p> <p>If you would like to continue with this, there is an additional sheet in the resources called 'subtracting ones from two digit numbers with regrouping'.</p>

## Enrichment Tasks
