


History – We recently marked 75 Years since VE Day. This is not the only World War 2 anniversary being celebrated this year. It has also been 80 years since the evacuation of Dunkirk. Do you know anything about this? With the help of the English Heritage Website, we are going to look at the part that Dover Castle, in Kent played in this event.
