Who was Saint Nicholas?

On Christmas Eve, he sets off in his sleigh to deliver all of the gifts. He is helped on his way by his nine magical reindeer; Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donner, Blitzen and Rudolph.

Did you know?

- On Christmas Eve, Saint Nicholas delivers presents to 90 million children.
- Rudolph was added to the reindeer team one Christmas Eve during a bad snowstorm. Rudolph, with his glowing red nose, lit the way to make sure that all of the presents were delivered in time.
- His sleigh travels at around 671 million miles per hour!

Who was Saint Nicholas?

Saint Nicholas lived around 1,700 years ago in part of Turkey. He grew up living with his parents and showed his generosity from a young age. When he was bought a gift, Saint Nicholas would share it with his friends. He loved giving presents and therefore it was no surprise that he decided to become a bishop where he could help people by spreading the word of God.

Patron Saints

- A patron saint is someone who watches over and represents a place, person or activity.
- Saints often became patron saints of the place where they were born.
- There are many countries around the world who have a patron saint. In England, the patron saint is Saint George and in Wales it is Saint David. In Scotland, they have Saint Andrew as their patron saint and in Ireland it is Saint Patrick.

One of the most popular stories about Saint Nicholas is when he helped a poor man who did not have enough money for his three daughters to get married. During the night, Nicholas secretly threw a bag of gold through the man's open window while the man slept. It landed in the eldest daughter's stocking that was drying by the fire. The next morning, the family were amazed and delighted by the gift they had received. Saint Nicholas often carried out his good deeds at night as he was a modest man who did not want any thanks.

Saint Nicholas gave his life to helping others and after he died, he became known as the saint of gift-giving. It is thought that Saint Nicholas now lives in the North Pole and every Christmas Eve, he visits the homes of boys and girls around the world. He brings gifts to children to spread joy and happiness at Christmas.

Saint Nicholas

Who was Saint Nicholas?

Saint Nicholas was born in Patara, which would now be part of Turkey, around 1,700 years ago. He was a generous person who, even from a young age, wanted to share his toys with other children. When he grew up, Saint Nicholas became a Christian bishop who devoted his life to helping the poor and needy. Stories are told of Saint Nicholas' selfless deeds, including giving money to a poor family by leaving money in their stockings that were drying by the fire.

What is a Saint?

- It is believed that a saint is someone who has a high level of holiness.
- A saint is a kind and honourable person.
- There are believed to be many different saints who each represent different virtues. For example, Saint Christopher who watches over travellers and Saint Valentine who is the patron saint of love and marriage.

Over the years, stories of his miracles and the work that he did for the poor, spread to other parts of the world. Saint Nicholas was a modest man and would often carry out these good deeds at night whilst people were sleeping. When people woke in the morning, they would thank God for their gifts. When he died, he became known as the saint of gift-giving.

Saint Nicholas has become a beloved figure for many people. He has many different names, including Sinter Klaas in Holland, Saint Nikolaus in Germany and Father Christmas in the UK. Despite the different names, he is known for one thing - bringing happiness and joy to children all around the world. With the help of his faithful reindeer, his role is to deliver presents to around 90 million sleeping children on Christmas Eve each year.
