<p>Please try this quick comprehension: Polar bears have a great sense of smell. They can sniff out seals from almost 1km away even when they are under the ice. A fully-grown adult polar bear weighs between 175-650kg and measures approximately 2-3 metres in length. Polar bears need to hunt earlier each year due to climate change, which is melting the sea ice. This means their feeding season is shorter, giving them less time to build up their fat reserves. This is why polar bears are quickly becoming an endangered species.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. How long is an average adult polar bear?2.
