What great WOW words (adjectives) can you use?</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>LI: To identify and compare everyday materials for particular uses.</p> <p>Why did the great fire of London spread so quickly through the houses? Talk about the fact that they were made of wood. The materials that were used when building houses in those days were wood and straw. Discuss the terms 'material' and 'fabric' & clarify the difference: rehearse the fact that we use the word material scientifically to mean what objects are made from, not simply another word for fabric, which is how the word is sometimes used in everyday life.</p> <p>Go through natural/man made PowerPoint</p> <p>Discuss that different items can be made of different materials, and they are usually made of the material that has the best properties for the item.</p>

			<p>list properties of materials- hard, soft, flexible, smooth, transparent <u>Ask:</u> questions such as: <i>Why are the windows made of glass?
