Watch www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/z47w2hv Task: Now put a source of sound (ticking clock, ipod playing music etc) at one end of the room. Measure the distance between yourself and the source, using (where possible) a tape measure. Then place the source a metre closer and then another metre closer, until the clock is as close as it can get. Note how loud the clock sounds in each position. Blindfolded, now try to guess the distance of the source of sound, just from hearing it. How accurate were you? Cup your ears with a hand - does it make the ticking easier to hear? You can try this with different objects or in different settings. What happens outside? Are you as good at guessing the distance then?
