


Map of the Roman Empire in AD 117









2. Why do you think the Romans didn't conquer more of Europe?

Pupils' own responses, showing understanding of native people resisting Roman invasions, such as: 'I think the Romans didn't conquer more of Europe as the native people fought back and defeated their army (such as in Scotland). The further away lands were from Rome, the harder it was for them to be defended, so it may have been decided that the effort wasn't worth it.'
