On school days Clare is given £5 per day by her parents. She spends £1.50 on the bus. For lunch she buys a Panini, a piece of fruit and Fresh Juice. How much does Clare spend each day? How much does she have left? How much does she have left after the 5 school days? On school days Mike gets £5 per day from his parents. He spends £1.50 on the bus. Before school each day he buys a can of coke for 60p. For lunch he buys, pizza, chips and a biscuit. Each day on his way home he buys sweets for 50p. (Mike needs a lesson on healthy eating choices!) Using the information given work out how much money Mike spends each day? How much money does he have left? After the 5 school days how much does he have left?

PSHE: If you had £5 each day, how would you spend your money and what would you do with the money you may have saved? (Use the menu from the maths activity to help). Explain why it is important to budget your money carefully.
